## "Tema: A segment of Kenyan women practical feminism." Jackline Awoko March 23rd, 2006 - 1:30 - 3:20pm/AQ 3149

Tema is a luhya word meaning to try. Women in the village where Awoko was born, like most women in Kenya formed a self help group to help them meet the challenges of poverty and disease. Yet in intellectual discourse, this self help is part of the wider feminism that exists in resistance to patriarchy and in an attempt to transform the world based on the principles of equality. Awoko is in her final stage of M.A Sociology at UBC. Her research was with immigrant women from Africa in Canada, mainly focussing on how theynegotiate new gendered roles within the family in Canada.
