She has served on various advisory bodies to the government of New Zealand regarding arms control and disarmament and as an NGO adviser to the government's delegation to the U.N. Special Session on Disarmament in 1988. She has been an active member of many national and international organizations working to promote nuclear disarmament including the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, Greenpeace, the United Nations Association and recently the Middle Powers Initiative. She is the author of many academic and newspaper articles on the subject of nuclear weapons and nuclear disarmament and recently wrote the book, "Pacific Women Speak Out for Independence and Denuclearisation".
