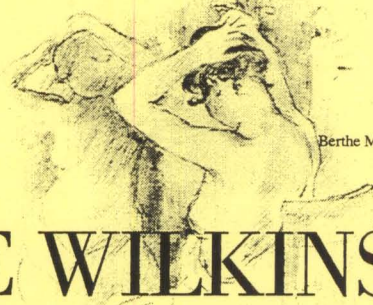

She has published 6 books and more than 60 articles on gender issues and feminist research, focusing on women's health, especially breast cancer, and on sexuality and sexual identity.
