There has been much discussion recently around the issue of recovered memory, especially as related to issues of sexual abuse. Dr. Kimball, in a lecture at North Island College in Port Hardy, will describe some of the history in this debate.

Freud initially argued that hysteria in adults was a result of childhood sexual abuse. He soon abandoned this theory, focussing instead on childhood sexual fantasies. Dr. Kimball will discuss Freud's theory and retraction as well as the history of thinking about the relationship between childhood trauma and adult mental illness.
