

Women's Experience of Breast Cancer

I will outline and present selected findings from a multi-method project on women's experiences of breast cancer. The project rests on a core data set of 13 focus group discussions with 80 women who have received a breast cancer diagnosis. Additional data sets include focus groups with their (male) partners, and with lesbians talking about breast cancer; plus interviews, ethnographic observation, written documents and questionnaires. My analyses of these data address practical issues of how best to improve support and services for women with breast cancer; theoretical issues related to the deployment of identities (as women, as breast cancer survivors, as healthcare service users); and methodological issues about different approaches to analyzing qualitative data.
