

# **WOMEN'S STUDIES AT SIMON FRASER UNIVERSITY**

### CHRONOLOGY

1971	First credit course at SFU, the <i>Geography of Gender</i> team taught by Margaret Benston, Pat Davitt, Wendy Eliot-Hurst, Bob Horsfall, and Andrea Lebowitz.
1976	Women's Studies minor begins – first course in the program, Introduction to Women's Studies, offered by Anita Fellman with 40 students.
1976	Meredith Kimball receives Women's Studies first appointment
1985	M.A. program begins
1985	Ruth Wynn Woodward Professorhip begins with a \$500,000 grant
	from the Women's Program, Secretary of State and ultimately received matching funds from the Vancouver Foundation and Ruth Wynn Woodward's daughters Mary Twigg White and Elizabeth Russ.
1994	Margaret Lowe Benston Lectureship for Social Justice Established with Ursula Franklin giving the first lecture
1995	Women's Studies major established
1995	Women's Studies becomes a full department
2004	Ph.D. program begins with five students
